Chief Warrant Officer 3 Thomas Michael Hoare was born and raised in Northern Manhattan to Frank and Ann Hoare. He has a brother Francis, and sister Ann Marie. CWO Hoare's father, the late Frank Hoare hailed from County Roscommon, Ireland and his mother, Ann (nee Hughes), from County Mayo, Ireland. Raised in Washington Heights, he attended Incarnation Grammar School and Saint Nicholas of Tolentine High School. CWO 3 Hoare is happily married to the former Carolyn Conway of Annapolis, Maryland. They currently reside in the Northern Manhattan community of Inwood.

CWO Hoare attended Fordham University where he received a Bachelor of Arts in Economics in 1986. After graduating from Fordham, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps Reserves. CWO Hoare completed basic training at Parris Island, South Carolina; and received orders to Camp Lejeune, North Carolina; where he graduated from the Field Wireman's Communication's Course. Subsequently, he transferred to 6th Communication Battalion, Brooklyn, New York; where he served for the next four years. In November 1990, then a Corporal, CWO Hoare was mobilized for Operation Desert Shield and deployed to South West Asia with 8th Communication Battalion, 2nd Surveillance, Reconnaissance and Intelligence Group. CWO Hoare attached to Marine Wing Communication Squadron 38 where he served as a Squad Leader during Operation Desert Storm. He re-deployed back to the United States at the end of May 1991, and was demobilized in June of that year. In 1993, CWO Hoare was promoted to Sergeant and took part in cold weather training in Norway (Battle Griffen). In 1995, he was promoted to Staff Sergeant and attended Communication Systems Chief's course at Twentynine Palms, California. CWO Hoare was promoted to Warrant Officer in December 1998, and attended the Warrant Officer Basic Course in Quantico, Virginia in the summer of 1999. In August 1999, CWO Hoare attended the Anti-Terrorism/ Force Protection course.

In January 2003, Chief Warrant Officer 2 Thomas Hoare served as Platoon Commander and was mobilized and deployed with 6th Communication Battalion to Kuwait in support of Operation Enduring Freedom/ Operation Iraqi Freedom. His billets included, Systems Planning and Engineering Officer, Platoon Commander, Watch Officer and acting Battalion S-2. While deployed, CWO Hoare was promoted to Chief Warrant Officer 3 during the security and stabilization operations and was returned to the United States in August 2003. In June 2004, CWO Hoare was called to duty again and deployed to Ar Ramadi, Iraq with the 1st Marine Division where he served as the System Planning & Engineering Officer and Network Manager for the Division G-6 and Communications Company, 1st Marine Division. CWO Hoare returned home in March of 2005, and currently to serves as Executive Officer, Support Company, 6th Communication Battalion.

In his professional career, CWO Hoare is a Vice President and Portfolio Manager with JPMorgan Private Bank where he has worked for more than 20 years, starting his career with the former Manufactures Hanover Trust Company.
